## **Renewal Community Chest Final Report**

### **Introduction:**

Renewal Community Chest was set up by Renewal to help Refugee Community Organizations based in six west London boroughs Brent, Ealing, Hammersmith and Fulham, Harrow, Hillingdon and Hounslow. Community chest grants allowed refugee community organizations to access wide range of resources that were not normally accessible from other funding sources. Since the start of community chest, the scheme has supported 204 refugee community organizations based in six-west London boroughs. Ealing and Brent boroughs have the highest number of refugee community organizations supporting the needs of refugee population in West London. The breakdown of refugee community organizations supported from renewal community chest per borough: Ealing 59, Brent 53, Hammersmith and Fulham 28, Hillingdon 23, Hounslow 21 and Harrow 20.

### **Renewal Community Chest Aims and Objectives:**

The aim of the Community Chest is to help Refugee Community Organizations to increase their organizational capacity to deliver effective services to refugee communities who live in the six west London boroughs. Monitoring or Routine evaluation refers to ongoing data collection of a programme's activities and outputs. It provides feedback on whether programmes are fulfilling their work or having improved their programme and what they learned from the experience. This report will mainly concentrate on the process and the outcome of the scheme where possible.

Renewal Community Chest operated on a quarterly basis grant scheme so all organizations that received funding under the scheme are required to submit a monitoring report at the end of the project as this enables Renewal to measure the effectiveness of the grants awarded for equipments. Project activities seek to achieve one or more of the following project activities which improve communication links i.e. through information technology, enhance staff and volunteer skills through training & development, improve capacity and skills in fund-raising, helping an organization with start-up costs for office equipments and strengthening organization through business planning to offer support with consultancy, research and community consultation or events etc.

### **Monitoring and evaluation:**

The self-evaluations forms were given to randomly selected six groups from different refugee community organizations for in depth interview as sample for our community chest monitoring. Following were taken from organizations funded from renewal community chest. To check how they are going to maintain their organizations work, which was supported from renewal community chest with capacity building. Some of the organizations interviewed filled self-evaluation forms that clearly indicated they have sustainability plan to continue their organizations activities beyond renewal community chest scheme. They showed in the community chest evaluation forms that they have applied for further funding from different funders to support their organizations activities to deliver services to their communities in a grass-root level as well as continue to build their organizations capacity.

Some of the organizations mentioned self – evaluation forms that they have already applied funding for both short term and long term plan from Brent council ‘Wembley Trust’, Ealing council, Local Network Connexion, London Council previous name ALG, Bridge House Trust, Baron Foundation, Lottery,

To assess the impact community chest had on refugee community organizations and their users. Self-monitoring questionnaire were given to six organizations.

Following reasons were taken into account.

- Community they represent or deliver services
- Area organization based in West London
- The impact community chest had on their organization
- The impact community chest had on their users
- To find out if they have sustainability plan to continue their services beyond renewal community chest that supported them with capacity building of their organizations.

### **Current Financial Year:**

This financial year we had three rounds or quarters so the funding for the last round was allocated to the forums for the refugee week in June 2006. Consequently this made it one round short and last quarter for January 2007 was cancelled. Twenty-seven organizations applied to community chest grant and the panel awarded 19 organizations for grants and total spending for the year was **£48,478**. Most of the grants applied were for capacity building as the whole reason for community was to support organizations with capacity building of their organizations.

Some of the information are extracted from current financial year monitoring forms are as following; Renewal Community Chest has helped groups with capacity building such as

- Office equipments
- Community consultations events to share and exchange information with service users.
- Interpretation and translations; improve communication with other voluntary groups, volunteers and users via email, letters.
- Produce newspapers in community languages.
- Broadcast relevant news through local radio in their community languages
- Publicity enabled groups to market their services through to the internet, helping users with housing problems, immigrations problems through interpretation and advocacy.
- Trained management committee members of how start up own organization business plan and become registered charity.

### **Conclusion:**

Renewal community chest helped refugee community organizations with capacity building of their organizations. While doing the self-evaluation interviews all the organizations mentioned difficulties they will face without renewal support. They all wished that renewal had continued the work they have undertaken for the last six-year as they the main supporters of refugee community organizations in West London. They also mentioned their refugee community organizations lack the capacity to get bigger funding from the central government. They said they were very grateful to Ealing Primary Trust for all the good work they done on behalf of their organizations. As it was Ealing Primary Trust initiative that brought and allowed them to get the Single generations Budget from the Government to address refugee issues in West London.

Refugee community supported from the community chest grant, some of them lack the capacity to have office premises, some of them operate from their own homes to help their communities to overcome some of the problems they face, some have hot desk space once or twice a week while other have access to full office space. Also most of them rely on volunteers for most of their work, as they do not have full time staff to deliver services. This show the commitment and sacrifices refugee community organizations are making on behalf of their communities irrespective of how hard its to work without proper resources to handle the work and overcome barriers that prevent them to access services and advocacy.

Renewal community chest has helped refugee community organizations to help their communities by supporting them with capacity building. They strongly agreed that the community chest application form and process was very straightforward and easy to understand. This has given them the opportunity to start and develop their organizations capacity and appreciated the training their volunteers done because of the grants they received from renewal community chest to deliver better services for their users and enable them to access services available. Build youth support drop in centers, some organizations developed media communication services for their communities such as Afghan radio, Kurdish radio and Albanian newspaper all these services inform their communities issues relating to their communities and deliver services in their languages.

This shows how renewal community chest made it possible for the refugee community organizations to deliver services to their communities in grass-root level.
